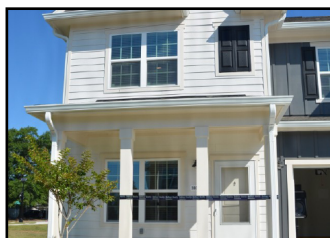
Army, industry improve supply chain resiliency

WASHINGTON – The Army, in partnership with industry and academia, is breaking through historical barriers to develop alternate sources of supply and give Soldiers the ability to repair their equipment anywhere around the globe. Critical maintenance tasks have been tethered to inflexible supply chains because the Army could not access proprietary technical data for decades. Today, that paradigm is shifting.



Supporting digital foundation for OIB transformation

FORT HUACHUCA, Ariz. – As the Army shifts its focus toward the demands of large-scale combat operations, the industrial infrastructure that has sustained our military since WWII is undergoing a digital transformation. Army Materiel Command is spearheading a 15-year, \$18 billion Modernization Implementation Plan to overhaul the 23 depots, arsenals and ammunition plants.



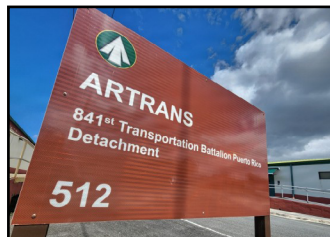
Fort Gordon cuts ribbon on new housing

FORT GORDON, Ga. – Fort Gordon gathered to celebrate the official ribbon cutting for Pine Tree Terrace, the installation's newest neighborhood designed to support privates and junior non-commissioned officers. The event marked the opening of 72 modern townhomes and four single-family homes, the first phase in a \$431 million investment to enhance on-base housing.



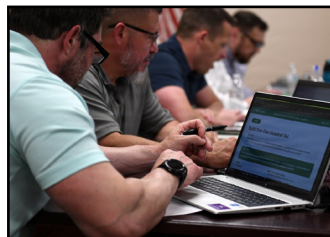
New ride-share offers free rides across Fort Carson

FORT CARSON, Colo. – The Mountain Post launches a new free ride-share program June 1, for service members, their families and civilians working on Fort Carson. Carson Connector is an app-based system that links users to multiple 15-passenger vans. Two ADA-compliant vans can be requested when families need more support for items such as car seats, luggage and grocery bags.
