REGULARLY SCHEDULED PROGRAMS

Baby & Me Lapsit (ages 0 – 3 yrs)

Tuesday 10:00 AM || Wednesday 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM

Bond with your baby and introduce them to the wonders of reading when you join us for simple stories, songs, rhymes, and fun.

Storytime (ages 3 -5 yrs)

Thursday 10:30 AM and 1:30 PM

This program combines reading, physical activity, and a craft or STEAM project to keep the children engaged. It promotes early literacy and developmental skills as well as encourages social interaction.

Dungeons & Dragons (D&D)

Saturday 12:00 PM – 4:00 PM

This program is designed to bring together all levels of D&D players for a weekly campaign or one-shot campaign set in D&D 5E.

Victorian Teatime Book Club (ages 13 yrs and up)

3rd Wednesday of every month 5:00 PM

A celebration of Victorian authors from all nations active during Queen Victoria's lifetime (1819-1901). Participants will meet to discuss their passion for the Victorian era over a good cup of hot tea and a biscuit, and swoon over their favorite authors from around the world. Participants can come in Victorian era costumes.

Creative Play for Toddlers (ages 3 and under)

2nd Monday of every month at 10:00 AM

This program is designed to allow little ones to explore and discover sensory play and artistic expression using a variety of "toddler safe" materials. Please dress your child to get messy.

Makerspace Programs (ages 6 and up)

These programs may be a craft, art or even STEAM activity. The intent is to introduce and encourage patrons to explore and develop an interest in a variety of arts and crafts. STEM programs are intended to promote science and math development through fun and challenging activities. All materials are provided.

CREATIVE PLAY FOR TODDLERS

Homeschool Science Club (Middle School: 5th – 8th grade)

This is a 2-hour program. The first part will be for students to conduct an experiment or activity (i.e. build a robot). The second part will be for the students to decide what experiment or activity they would like to do the following month. They will determine what materials they will need and theorize what results they expect.

Homeschool Book Club (Middle School: 5th – 8th grade)

2nd Monday of each month 2:00 PM.

The participants will choose from a selection of recommended books. Books will be based on specific genre or themes rather than having everyone read the exact same book. Participants will meet the following month to discuss their books. The meetings will have guidance from library staff but will encourage student lead discussions.
