## **Relocation Support Programs for Families**

### Hearts Apart

Hearts Apart is a support program for spouses and Families who are geographically separated from their service member while on a short tour (unaccompanied PCS) or TDY longer than 90 days.

We host an event on the fourth Wednesday of each month, such as Coffee and Chat, and a monthly movie afternoon (the fourth Saturday). These events allow Families to meet others experiencing a short tour or long TDY. At our Coffees and Chat, we discuss topics such as life skills, activities, or other issues that are important to them.

We are here to provide them with resources and support while their service member is away.

### International Spouses Group

International Spouses is a support program for foreign-born spouses. Participating in this group allows you to meet other spouses who are also foreign-born.

We host an event on the second Wednesday of the month and offer a movie afternoon monthly(the fourth Saturday). During our meetings, we discuss life skills, communication topics, special events, and other essential topics for the spouses.

We can assist spouses with learning the area, getting acclimated, and providing resources to help them settle into the Fort Campbell community and surrounding area.

## **Navigating Holiday Spending: A Balancing Act**

The holiday season is a time of joy and celebration, but it can also be a period of financial stress for many. Holiday spending in the military, just like for anyone else, requires careful budgeting and financial planning. Here are some specific holiday spending tips for military Families:

- **Plan Ahead:** start planning for the holidays well in advance. Knowing the specific dates for your leave or time off will help you create a budget and make travel or celebration plans.
- Use Military Discounts: Many retailers, restaurants, and travel services offer military discounts. Take advantage of these offers to save money on gifts, dining out, and travel.
- Stick to a Budget: Create a holiday budget that factors in ALL your expenses, including gifts, travel, decorations, and entertainment. Stick to this budget to avoid overspending.
- Thrift Stores and Exchange Stores: Consider shopping at thrift stores or at your local Exchange store, where you can often find good deals on clothing and gifts. You will also save on sales tax at your local Exchange store.
- Send Care Packages: If your Family is far away from where you're stationed, consider sending care packages with personalized gifts. This can be cost-effective way to show you care.
- **Travel Smart:** When traveling for the holidays, try to book your flights or accommodations in advance to secure better rates. Take advantage of military discounts when available.
- Limit Credit Card Use: Avoid using credit cards excessively. If you must use them, make sure you have a plan to pay off the balance promptly to avoid high-interest charges.
- **Financial Counseling:** Take advantage of our ACS Financial Readiness services! We offer guidance on managing debt, creating budgets, and saving for future. ## **AFTB Celebrates 29 Years!!**

The Army Family Team Building program will celebrate its 29th anniversary next month and continues to adjust its course offerings to better serve the needs of Soldiers, Families and our total Army Family.

AFTB is a Family training and readiness program that provides participants with a better understanding of Army culture, as well as the skills and resources needed to become resilient, self-sufficient and self-reliant members of the military community. It is a program that changes and grows with the times to best meet the needs of a changing Army and the changing needs of Army Families.

AFTB classes focus on "Know, Grow, Lead", Level 'K (1)' is military knowledge, Level 'G (2)', growth and resilience and Level 'L (3)', is leadership development.

Each level provides a variety of modules that offer progressive instruction built to equip attendees with the skills necessary to navigate through the Army system, understand the military mission and way of life and to successfully access the many resources and services available on the installation.

Coming up in the new year, AFTB will be changing their course offerings to include shorter class times and evening classes, so that individuals can find the courses that meet their needs and best fit into their schedules. Courses do not need to be taken in any particular order; the LEARN, GROW, LEAD is set up to connect Families to the Army one Class at a Time.

Level K is for people who are new to the military, new Family members, or perhaps new to Fort Campbell. Level K covers basic Army information, acronyms, military time, rank structure, etc.

Levels G and L do not build on Level K, but rather focus more on personal growth and personal development, and into leadership development.

AFTB runs on volunteers! For individuals who would like to learn more and / or get involved, we invite you to come visit us on 15 December 2023, 9am -11am, as we celebrate 29 years of serving our military community.
