Theft of property, Curfew, and Supervision of Children

- Ensure vehicles are secured, keys are retained on person not left in fuel door or behind vehicle tires (key FOB or spare key in vehicle).
- Secure garage doors when not in use.
- Secure quarters when not at the residence.
- Add additional security measures when small children are present.
- Juveniles under 5 may not be left unattended, ages 5-9 close to home within hearing or eyesight
 of supervision, age 10 home alone for 3 hours age11 home alone for 6 hours, ages11-13 may
 babysit; Reference CAM Reg 608-3
- Curfew for juveniles is 2300-0600 hours
- Juveniles issued ID cards are required to have ID in their possession and submit to LEO upon request.

Summer Fire Safety Charcoal Cooking

- Place gas grills, charcoal grills, deep fryers at least 10 feet from any combustible structure.
- Use of any grill, deep fryer on 2d-floor balconies or under overhangs is unauthorized.
- Always check fire danger rating in your area to determine if weather or other factors make it dangerous to light a fire.
- Only use lighter fluid intended for charcoal grills.
- Never add lighter fluid to coals or kindling are already ignited.
- Keep children, pets, and all items that can burn away from the open flames and grill.
- Use long-handled grilling tools.
- Keep the fire small and never leave a fire unattended!!!

To Dispose of Charcoal After Cooking:

- empty the coals into a metal container with a tight-fitting lid that is used only to collect coals,
- never empty coals into a trash can
- place the container outside and away from anything that can burn,
- before going to sleep or leaving the area, douse the fire with water and make sure the area is cool to the touch.

Store charcoal lighter fluid out of reach of children and away from heat sources.

TRICARE Retiree Dental Program

The TRICARE Retiree Dental Program (TRDP) ends on Dec. 31, 2018. The last day to enroll in TRDP is Oct. 31, 2018. Beginning in 2019, dental and vision plans will be available through the Office of Personnel Management's Federal Dental and Vision Insurance Program (FEDVIP).

- Vision: Eligible TRICARE beneficiaries will have four vision plan options.
- Dental: FEDVIP Dental will replace the current TRICARE Retiree Dental Program (TRDP). If you currently have TRDP, you will need to enroll in FEDVIP Dental to have dental coverage in 2019.

If you're eligible, the first opportunity to enroll in FEDVIP is during the 2018 Open Season. Coverage will start Jan. 1, 2019. For more details on the new coverage options, visit TRICARE.benefeds.com and sign up for email updates.
