NOVEMBER IS WARRIOR CARE MONTH

November is Warrior Care Month (WCM) for the Department of Defense (DOD).

WCM is an important DOD-wide effort to increase awareness of programs and resources available to wounded, ill, and injured Service members, as well as their Families, caregivers, and others who support them. This year's theme is "Right Soldier for the Right Reason."

The ACS Soldier and Family Assistance Center (SFAC) provides tailored and integrated services and programs to expedite and enhance the transition and recovery of wounded, injured, seriously ill and terminally Soldiers and their Family Members as part of the Army's Warrior Care and Transition Program (AR 40-58).

The SFAC facility is designed and resourced to provide a relaxed environment that fosters physical, spiritual and mental healing. The Ft Campbell SFAC is co-located with our Warrior Transition Battalion (WTB) in building 2433 on the corner of 20th and Indiana Street.

This year the ACS-SFAC program in collaboration and in partnership with the WTB, Office of Secretary Defense Warrior Care Policy, EFMP, Defense and Veterans Brain Injury Center and others has planned for

Caring for and supporting wounded, ill and injured Soldiers and their Families is an enduring mission and sacred obligation. Clearly, there is no greater or higher calling than helping the wounded, ill and injured Soldiers heal and transition successfully back to the force or into private sector jobs and careers.

During November, Warrior Transition Units and Army leaders across the country will host employment fairs, professional development sessions, open houses, media days, adaptive sports and reconditioning events to honor and celebrate the resilience of wounded, ill and injured Soldiers and their Families.

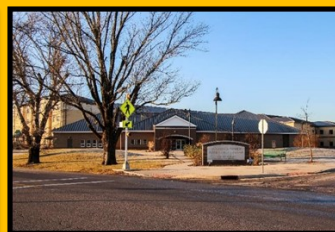
