- Your social security card and the social security card of any dependent you claim (required by IRS for verification of identity)
- 2. Birth dates
- 3. Valid form of government issued identification
- 4. Your previous year tax returns
- All tax documentation issued to include but not limited to W2, 1099 series documents, and any other income related documents
- Expense related documents to include but not limited to IRS form 1098, Business expenses, child care expenses (with childcare provider TIN), Property and real estate tax documents
- 7. Eligibility- Active duty, retirees and family members and reservists on Title 10 orders

2019 Tree Planting Priorities

DPW Forestry Service had created a plan to plant 1000 trees on Ft. Campbell in order to:

- Replace missing or aging trees (2 trees for every tree removed).
- Provide shade and absorb solar radiation.
- Decreasing water runoff, and increasing infiltration into the soil and evapotranspiration through the trees.
- Maintaining 60% of the cantonment area as improved or unimproved open space.
- Stabilizing soil to reduce erosion and stabilize sinkholes.
- · Beautify the area and provide cleaner air.
- Provide habitat diversification.



2019 Tree Planting Priorities

Volunteer dates are 9-23 February, 2019. Volunteers will plant 520 bare root, and Contractors will plant 615 trees. 1135 in total trees to be planted here on Ft. Campbell this year!




