Blanchfield Hospital has developed 2 paths for treatment:

- **Mandatory (Enrolled) Care and Voluntary Care**
 - Encourages personal responsibility to seek help earlier in their illness
 - Maintains full accountability for indiscipline events, full commander visibility on all Soldiers with illicit drug use and on all Soldiers with duty impairment or safety risk due to any substance use
 - Improves Soldier readiness by decreasing unnecessary enrollment & deployment ineligibility
 - Very similar to the current population enrolled in ASAP
 - All SMs who are diagnosed with a SUD and have a verified drug positive test or substance/alcohol indiscipline event (DUI, assault, UCMJ, etc.)
 - All cases involving occupational, readiness or safety impairment, regardless of which SUD diagnosis
 - All cases requiring higher levels of care, such as inpatient care
 - Renders a Soldier non-deployable for 12 months to CENTCOM AOR (per MOD 13 deployability guidance)
 - Soldier may not discontinue care
- **Voluntary SUD Clinical Care**

- Many Soldiers eligible for Voluntary Care are not receiving treatment currently
- Only alcohol-related SUDs without occupational, readiness or safety impairment are eligible for Voluntary Care
- Command disclosure is managed like all other BH/medical conditions
- Does not render a Soldier non-deployable
- Soldier may discontinue care

Missed Drug Take Back Day?

Properly dispose of your expired, unused or unwanted medicine by dropping them in the Drug Drop Boxes placed inside the hospital's Main Pharmacy or Town Center Pharmacy during business hours. Accepted items include: prescription medications, controlled substance medication, over-the-counter medication, vitamins, medicated ointment/lotion, liquid medication in leak-proof containers and transdermal skin patches. *Items not accepted include: needles, thermometers, contraband drugs, infectious waste/medical waste, personal care products, business waste, hydrogen peroxide, aerosol cans, and inhalers.*

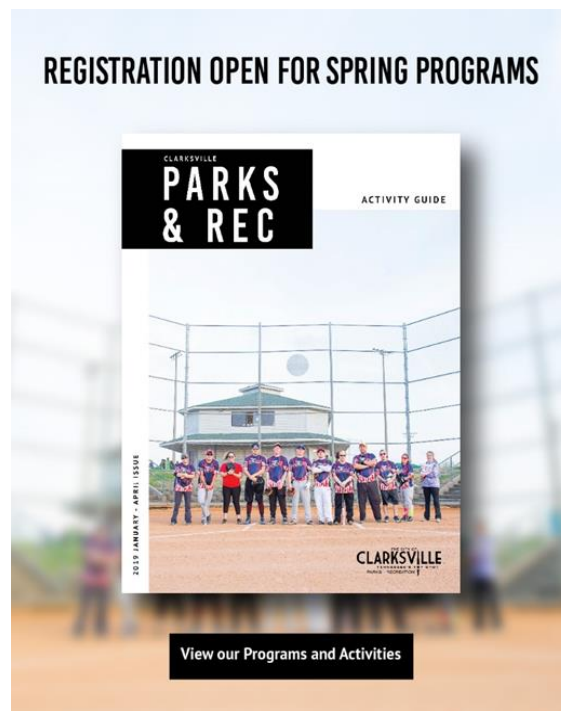
