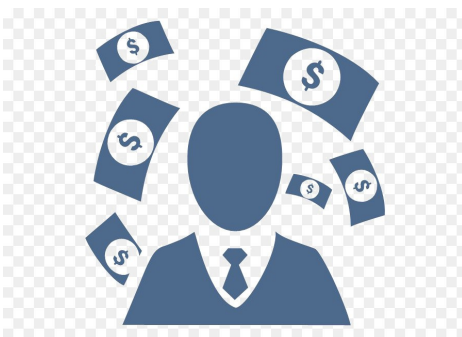
How we communicate about our finances has severe impacts on marriages, careers and stress.
