Gold Star Mother's and Family's Day

Gold Star Mother's and Family's Day is observed on the last Sunday in September. This National Day of Remembrance acknowledges the sacrifice, loss, and resilience of Gold Star Family Members while also honoring the memory of their fallen heroes who have made the ultimate sacrifice in service of their country.

Gold Star Mother's and Family's Day traces its origins back to World War I, when Families displayed blue stars on banners representing their loved ones who were fighting overseas. Upon receiving notification of their service member's death, the blue star would be replaced with a gold star. In 1936, Congress officially recognized the last day in September as Gold Star Mother's Day. Later, it expanded to include Gold Star Mothers and Families.

Gold Star Mother's and Family's Day continues to unite communities to honor the fallen and support their families. It is a time for remembrance and gratitude, acknowledging the ongoing strength and resiliency of the families. Gold Star Mothers and Families will be honored during the Gold Star Mother's and Family's Day Memory Share Ceremony at Fort Campbell on Friday, September 26th. Company Commander & First Sergeant Spouse Course

The Company Commander & First Sergeant Spouse Course is just one of the many support resources offered through the Army Family Team Building (AFTB) Program at Fort Campbell. This course is specifically designed to prepare and empower the spouses of newly appointed company commanders and First Sergeants as they transition into their new leadership adjacent roles.

Army Family Team Building is a comprehensive training program provided by Army Community Service. Its mission is to help military families become resilient, self-sufficient, and confident members of the Army community. AFTB offers progressive training that covers military knowledge, personal growth, leadership development, and practical life skills-all within the context of Army culture. The Company Commander and First Sergeant Spouse Course focuses on providing foundational knowledge to help build a strong, supportive partnership between leadership and families. It covers responsibilities, expectations, and potential challenges spouses may face, equipping them to support their Soldiers and units effectively.

Topics covered in the course include protocol, the appropriate use of social media, mentoring, customs, courtesies, and military traditions. Attendees will learn essential skills such as effective communication, problem solving, and volunteer management-all critical components for building and supporting strong, successful Soldier and Family Readiness Groups (SFRGs). Additionally, spouses will become familiar with local resources, enabling them to provide informed support and appropriate referrals. The course helps clarify roles expectations, empowering spouses to engage authentically and sustainability within their unit's family support network. This course is a valuable opportunity for spouses to develop practical skills, ease the transition into leadership support roles, and gain tools that will benefit them across all areas of life.

The Company Commander and First Sergeant Spouse Course is built on the powerful principle that successful leadership in the Army extends beyond commanders and noncommissioned officers-it's a team effort that includes and values families. By educating, empowering, and supporting spouses, this course plays a vital role in strengthening the foundations of unit leadership. Through AFTB, family readiness is enhanced and the broader Army community is reinforced, directly contributing to mission success at the ground level.
