Army Family Team Building (AFTB) is an all-volunteer led group of subject matter experts who teach classes across three progressive levels: military knowledge, personal growth and resiliency, and professional development. Additionally, AFTB offers classes with a focus on training methodologies.

Individuals can develop or sharpen their presentation and facilitation skills. All AFTB classes are available to active duty Soldiers, retirees, and their Family members. AFTB is offering the following training courses this February at Army Community Service, 1501 William C. Lee Road:

Registration is required for all classes.

February 10-12 - Instructor Training Course, 9:00 AM - 3:00 PM, course covers the foundation of quality presentations skills, group interaction skills, and how to develop confidence presenting material.

February 13 – I Married a Soldier, Now What?, 6:15 PM - 8:00 PM, Provides an opportunity for new spouses to network while receiving an overview of what to expect in Army life.

February 24-25 – AFTB Army 101, 9:00 AM – 1:00 PM, course covers the fundamentals of the Army including acronyms/terms, rank/structure, benefits/entitlements, social functions, customs/traditions, SFRG, and community resources.

AFTB will offer the **Command Team Spouse Course** this spring. The Command Team Spouse Course is designed to help spouses understand the roles and responsibilities of command teams and how to get integrated into the unit.

This course targets spouses of Commanders and First Sergeants. Expect more information on this course as the date draws near.
