### I Corps reduces property demand on units through R2E

JOINT BASE LEWIS McCHORD, Wash. - Joint Base Lewis McChord recently began surging property turn-in as the Rapid Removal of Excess program continues across the Army. ### McAlester Ammunition Plant completes surge outload exercise

McALESTER, Okla. - A week of bustling activity at McAlester Army Ammunition Plant ensured the depot operations team executed its outload mission with a 100% completion rate and 19 hours ahead of the surge outload exercise scheduled stop time. The exercise began on June 3 with the team prepping and packaging 500 twenty-foot equivalent units in nine 12-hour shifts. "It is moving to watch thousands of tons of ammunition, prepared and loaded by the MCAAP teammates, to be shipped to serve our nation," said Todd Stone, depot operations director.

### DOD partners with utility company for pollution-free energy


