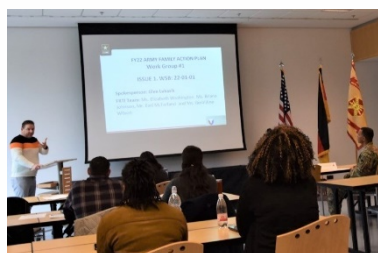
New Fort McCoy bridge construction completed

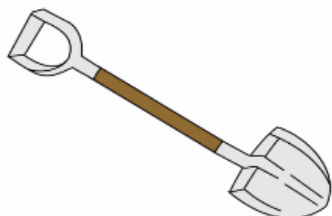
IMCOM GROUNDBREAKING EVENTS Through Feb. 11, 2022

Dec. 7, Yuma Proving Ground, 10 a.m. groundbreaking for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Los Angeles District, and the Special Operations Command to mark the beginning of construction for the MILCON SOF Hangar at U.S. Garrison Yuma Proving Ground, Laguna Army Airfield. Time TBD. USACE awarded the \$49.5M contract on Aug. 10, 2021, with scheduled completion o/a October 2023. Construction of new 47,000-square-foot two-bay, fixed-wing aircraft operations and maintenance hangar also includes 30,600 square yards of new taxiway Foxtrot, taxiway Alpha extension to runway 36, hangar access apron, personnel loading apron, and lighting for airfield pavements.

Dec. 20, USAG Bavaria, 10 a.m. groundbreaking for construction of 36 townhouse units. FY18 AFH-C, PN78713, project that will house Junior NCOs comprising 18 three-bedroom and 18 four-bedroom units. The project PA is \$22.5M with a projected start date of December 2021 and completion in September 2023.

Jan. 18, USAG Daegu, 10 a.m. ribbon-cutting for completion of 90 dwelling units comprising four five-bedroom units, 26 four-bedroom units, and 60 three-bedroom units in a 15-story tower. The project contract amount is \$50.5M with physical completion date of Nov. 25, 2022.

Feb. 1, USAG Humphreys, 7 p.m. ribbon-cutting for completion of three 12-story family housing towers to accommodate a total of 216 family dwelling units (144 three-bedroom units, 54 four-bedroom units and 18 five-bedroom units) will be completed in February 2022. The towers are currently at 96% completion.
