For example, as a society we rely more and more on technology to communicate and access information. However, we don't always think about the barriers to accessibility of digital content for individuals with visual, auditory, cognitive, and mobility impairments. Another issue is the continuous dehumanization of individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Be mindful of how offensive the word "retard" can be and join the effort to eliminate the R word from use. **DHAM** is a time to understand how disabilities impact individuals and their families, reflect on the significant contributions made by individuals with disabilities, and renew our commitment to creating a stronger future for them. On 1 October 2024 ACS EFMP will host a Cake Cutting at the Main Exchange from 11am until 1pm. A variety of resource support information will be shared, in addition to, interactive activities to strengthen Your awareness about visual and hearing disabilities.

DISABILITY BARRIERS

1. Attitudinal: See only individual's disability, bullying, discrimination, and fear.
2. Environmental: Inaccessible environments, natural or built, barriers to inclusion.
3. Institutional: Laws, policies, practices, or strategies that promote discrimination.

October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month

General Domestic Violence Statistics

- An average of 24 people per minute are victims of rape, physical violence or stalking by an intimate partner in the United States — more than 12 million women and men over the course of a single year.
- Nearly 3 in 10 women (29%) and 1 in 10 men (10%) in the US have experienced rape, physical violence, and/or stalking by a partner and reported it having a related impact on their functioning.
- Just under 15% of women (14.8%) and 4% of men in the US have been injured as a result of intimate partner violence that included rape, physical violence, and/or stalking by an intimate partner.
- Intimate partner violence alone affects more than 12 million people every year.
- 1 in 4 women (24.3%) and 1 in 7 men (13.8%) aged 18 and older in the US have been the victim of severe physical violence by an intimate partner in their lifetime.
- Over 1 in 3 women (35.6%) and 1 in 4 men (28.5%) in the US have experienced rape, physical violence, and/or stalking by an intimate partner in their lifetime.
- Almost half of all women and men in the US have experienced psychological aggression by an intimate partner in their lifetime (48.4% and 48.8%, respectively).
- Estimates suggest 13% of women and 6% of men will experience sexual coercion (unwanted sexual penetration after being pressured in a non-physical way) in their lifetime; 27.2% of women and 11.7% of men experience unwanted sexual contact.
- 1 in 6 women (16.2%) and 1 in 19 men (5.2%) in the US have been a victim of stalking at some point during their lifetime in which they felt fearful or believed that they (or someone close to them) would be harmed or killed.

R.E.A.L. SFRG Training

Readiness Essentials for Army Leaders

KEY CONTACT
Teaches the skills needed to keep all Family members informed of facts throughout each phase of the deployment cycle.

CARE TEAM
A Care Team is a group of 2-3 trained volunteers providing support to the Family of a deceased Soldier immediately following Official Death Notification.

COMMAND TEAM
Delineates the roles and responsibilities of the Command team regarding how to leverage the SFRG to execute the Family Readiness Program Mission.

SFRG ASSISTANT
Course covers rules and regulations, methods of communication, management of volunteers and how to guide unit Families through a SFRG.

INFORMAL FUND CUSTODIAN
Instructs how to keep track of SFRG funds, how to use them, and the rules of fundraising.

COMMAND FAMILY READINESS REPRESENTATIVE
Course designed to assist with the operational, logistical and administrative aspects of the SFRG for the commander's direct representative to the SFRG.
